

Advocacy Do's and Don'ts

- Do demonstrate yourself as a professional you are the expert
- Do follow gov't relations professional timing and direction
- National organizations and local individuals working together
- Do work with your Advocacy team for strategy, support, and meeting coordination
- Don't expect immediate change legislation can take time but success will only happen if you act and let your voice be heard over time
- Don't talk about elections or campaign donations during Hill meetings
- Do talk about your practice, how you help patients, your reasons for supporting recognition
- Do talk to your colleagues about supporting this effort

MATURING A BILL FOR A VEHICLE

- Maintain Hill presence
- Hold strategic constituent meetings
- Engage committee members and staff
- Establish internal and external strategic allies
- Prepare data for CBO score
- Maintain engagement with bill champions
- Introduce Senate Counterpart
- Hold Congressional briefings
- Keep bill balanced



BARRIERS TO SUPPORT/PASSAGE

- Cost concerns
- Opposition from influential groups
- Lack of CBO score
- Small/nonexistent constituent base
- Unfamiliarity with profession
- Lack of existing co-sponsors
- Lack of bipartisan support
- Lack of unity/support from profession



Why Medicare Recognition?

- Healthcare model is moving toward integrating and covering evidence-based, non-invasive treatments, such as acupuncture, to help better manage chronic-pain utilization.
- Medicare is the primary example and has authority to add coverage for treatments at any time but does not have the authority to add providers.
- Adding providers to the Medicare program requires an act of Congress, which is why the ASA/NCCAOM is pushing H.R. 3133, the Acupuncture for our Seniors Act.
- Service expansion becomes a case of supply and demand: without action on the federal level, other provider groups seek to expand their scopes



HR 3133: Medicare = Patient Benefits

Increases Awareness of Acupuncture

Increases Access to Care

- Underserved communities
- Vulnerable populations

Increases Access to Licensed Acupuncturists

- Providers with the most training
- Practicing a complete system of medicine

Medicare = Practice Benefits

- Increases Access to Patients
- Removes Supervision Requirement
- Allows Acupuncturists to Bill Directly
- Establishes a Model for Private Payers or Third-Party Insurance
- Increases Opportunities for Practice Settings
 - Hospitals and Multidisciplinary Clinics
- Increases Potential for Referrals



Medicare = Professional Benefits

- Job Growth
- Research and Generation of Standardized Data
- Increases Eligibility for Federal Student Loans and Student Loan Forgiveness
- Access to Other Federal Programs
- Educational Opportunities
- Appeal of Profession Students



Outcomes of Federal Advocacy

- Increases Access of Services to Seniors,
 Disabled and Underserved Communities
- Expands Job Opportunities for Qualified Practitioners and Promotes Credentials
- Strengthens Insurance Reimbursements
- Advances Whole System of Medicine Practice
- Promotes Public Education of Qualified Practitioners (Board Certification, etc.)
